We continue to work closely with the Government of Ontario as it rolls out its recently announced industry support programs. These important funding announcements, along with recent changes to modernize the retailing of alcohol, are foundational for supporting the success of the whole industry.

- New Ontario Grape Support Program aimed at increasing the number of Ontario grapes in bottles of wine
- Extension of the VQA Support program until 2029-30, and enhancements of the program eligibility to include ice wines
- Increase to Ontario's Risk Management Program (RMP) funding to support farmers in responding to market challenges while boosting their long-term business confidence and competitiveness.

New Federal Minister of Agriculture and Agri-Food, Heath MacDonald

On May 13, 2025, MacDonald was put into cabinet by Prime Minister Mark Carney, as apart of the 30th Canadian Ministry. He was appointed as Minister of Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada. MacDonald had previously served on the houses agriculture committee prior to entering cabinet.

Heath MacDonald is Member of Parliament for Malpeque. He was previously elected to the Legislative Assembly of Prince Edward Island in the 2015 provincial election, representing the electoral district of Cornwall-Meadowbank as a member of the Liberal Party until he resigned on August 18, 2021, in order to run in 2021 Canadian federal election.

Prior to his election as a Member of the Legislative Assembly, MacDonald was the Executive Director of Quality Tourism Services, Atlantic Canada Manager of Access Advisor, and President and Co-Founder of BamText Information Technology and Consulting. MacDonald has over 20 years' experience in the private sector with a focus on the tourism industry.

8th Annual General Meeting

CGCN-RCCV hosted their 8th Annual General Meeting on April 29th. Hans Buchler, CGCN-RCCV Chair since 2017, announced that this fiscal year (2025-26) will be his last year as Chair of the board. COMING SOON - Research Updates Recordings

On April 17th, CGCN-RCCV hosted a national meeting in collaboration with Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada (AAFC) and the British Columbia Wine Grape Council (BCWGC) to showcase the results of AAFC's research conducted under the Canadian Agricultural Partnership (CAP) Grape and Wine Science Cluster (2018-2023). Topics included Cold Hardiness & Climate Change, Quality Improvement, Management of Virus Diseases, and Crop Protection & Monitoring. Researchers presented key findings, impacts, and innovations shaping the future of viticulture and oenology, and concluded each session with a Q&A panel discussion.



OGWRI Research Spotlight

Potential Management Tools of the Spotted Lanternfly

The Spotted Lanternfly (SLF) has been a top-of-mind pest for all Ontario grape growers since 2018 because of its damaging effects on vineyards – reported to decrease fruit quality (brix and anthocyanins) and cold hardiness, and can reduce crop yields by up to 90%! Although established populations have not yet been reported in Ontario, the <u>Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA)</u> has confirmed various counts of live interceptions and other observations in Ontario since October 2024. With SLF at our doorstep, it is vital that our industry acts proactively by exploring possible treatment measures.

From May 2024 through March 2025, Ontario Grape and Wine Research Inc. (OGWRI) led a project titled "Identification of potential management tools for invasive Spotted Lanternfly." This project was conducted in collaboration with Virginia Tech, Brock University's Cool Climate Oenology and Viticulture Institute (CCOVI), and the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Agribusiness (OMAFA) with funding through the Ontario Agri-Food Research Initiative (OAFRI). The objectives of this project were three-fold:

- 1. Trial the efficacy of nine insecticides registered on grapes or other fruit crops in Canada against adult SLF populated vineyards in Virginia, USA.
- 2. Use the efficacy data to expand effective existing registered product labels and support registration of new products in Canada.
- 3. Use the results of this study to provide management recommendations to the industry.

The results of this trial suggest that *Admire* (imidacloprid), *UP-Cyde* (cypermethrin) and *Closer* (sulfoxaflor) provided rapid knockdown of SLF adults. *Admire*, *Closer* and *Sivanto Prime* (flupyradifurone) performed the best at the 7-day mark. These results were obtained by treating two vineyard blocks near wooded areas including tree-of-heaven; the upper block included Viognier and the lower block Petit Verdot. Each block was sprayed twice, once on July 31st and the second on August 21st, 2024, and counts were conducted on day one, seven and fourteen. Observations were based on counts of SLF

in the canopy and dead SLF on the ground. For complete details on research methodology and results, please visit the <u>"Archive"</u> of projects on OGWRI's website.

It is important to note that the results of this study are still under review by OMAFA and agri-chemical companies to determine appropriate label expansions in Ontario to treat adult SLF. But as of June 2024, two commercial insecticides are fully labelled in Canada for suppression of control of SLF nymphs and adults in grapes:

- Kopa Insecticidal Soap is registered for suppression of SLF nymphs, and;
- Sivanto Prime (flupyradifurone, group 4D) is registered for suppression of SLF (nymphs, adults).

In the meantime, to prevent SLF populations from establishing, it is critical for everyone in the industry, from nursery facilities to vineyard managers and workers, to THOROUGHLY inspect all supplies (plants, pallets, crates, tarps, toolboxes and containers), associated vehicles (including wheel wells, truck beds and caps, grooves and small spaces) and farm equipment when they arrive at and before they leave your operation.

OGWRI Research Spotlight Continued

Ensure staff and workers are trained to identify SLF life stages as shown below, especially egg masses as these are often mistaken for splotches of mud.



SLF life stages (from left to right): Overwintering egg mass, young nymphs, fourth instar nymph, and adult. As a proactive federal measure, the CFIA added SLF to the list of regulated pests in 2018 and requires nursery stock coming from the United States to include an SLF declaration on the phytosanitary certificate. Additional requirements may be requested, so it is important to use the Automated Import Reference System (AIRS) when planning to import nursery stock. Visit CFIA's website for more information on domestic and international movement requirements.




- TVQA wine sales overall are up 23.8% for rolling 13 periods (litres)

 - Ontario IDB is down (-7.1%)








Market Share (LCBO, Vintages, Grocery)
