# Annual General Meeting - Wed. April 2, 2025



All members of the Grape Growers of Ontario are invited to attend the 77th Annual General Meeting on Wednesday, April 2, 2025 at 7:00 pm.

**District 1 & 2** elections for the 2025-26 Growers' Committee will be conducted at the AGM, virtually or in-person at Club Roma (125 Vansickle Drive, St. Catharines).

District meetings and elections for **District 3** (Brant, Bruce, Chatham-Kent, Essex, Elgin, Grey, Haldimand, Huron, Lambton, Middlesex, Norfolk, Oxford, Perth and Waterloo) and **District 4** (Prince Edward County and all other geographic areas not included in District 1 to 3) will take place via Zoom prior to the AGM, see below for District 3 & 4 meeting dates.

**District 4** - Thursday, March 27 at 7:00 pm

**Register using the link provided by eblast.**

Registration is required. To be eligible to vote, you must have a grower number and have sold grapes in 2023 and/or 2024.

- Attending the AGM in-person? Registration opens at 6:30 pm at Club Roma. Photo identification is required.
- Attending virtually? Registration is required by April 1st at 4:30 pm by visiting the link provided by eblast and on [grapegrowersofontario.com](http://grapegrowersofontario.com). After registering for online participation, you will receive a confirmation email containing information about joining the meeting.

**IMPORTANT:** If you are unable to attend the AGM but would like to vote, please designate in writing the name of the individual representing you as your proxy for purposes of voting. A proxy cannot be given to someone already voting.

## **Nomination and Election Process for 2025/26 Growers' Committee:**

Voting will take place at the AGM for districts (1 and 2 as required). The Election Officer will open nominations by district, with in-person nominations taken first, followed by virtual nominations. Nominators online are asked to be on video to make the nomination. Each district's nominations will close following three calls for nominations, and nominees will be asked whether they allow their name to stand. Nominees are asked to be on video to accept the nomination.

Ballots will be provided in-person and via email, through Election Buddy, for virtual meeting participants.

- **Paper ballots** will be available by district for attendees at Club Roma. Growers will have their coloured voting card stricken out and given back in the case of a tie, and be given a voting ballot. Once complete, growers are to fill out and submit ballots into box.
- **Online ballots** will be populated in the online election platform Election Buddy, and each eligible grower participating on the zoom call will receive an email with a link to their district's ballot. The email will include a randomly generated access code, and the grower will use the four-digit grower number used to register for the meeting as their password. Please check your junk mail/spam if you do not receive the email in your inbox.

Upon close of voting, all ballot boxes will be removed and ballots counted in a separate room by the poll officials and the Election Officer will review the results of the online votes.

## **WSSP - 2025-26 Application Period**

The Wine Sector Support Program (WSSP), delivered by Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada, will accept applications for the 2025-26 program year from March 3, 2025 to May 23, 2025 (at 11:59 p.m. Pacific Daylight Time), unless otherwise announced on the program's webpage.

The WSSP offers short-term financial support to Canadian wine licensees to help adapt to ongoing and emerging challenges impacting the wine industry. Non-repayable grants are provided to licensed Canadian wineries based on their production of bulk wine fermented in Canada from domestic and/or imported primary agricultural products.

For this application period, eligible wine must have been produced (completed initial fermentation) between April 1, 2024 and March 31, 2025.

To determine if your organization is eligible, review the program criteria on our [webpage](#). The Application Form for 2025-26 will be available on March 3, 2025. To apply, complete and submit the Application Form (found in Step 4 on our webpage) with the required documents.

A new application must be submitted to the WSSP each year. Applications submitted to the WSSP in previous years are not transferable and will not be considered for 2025-26 grant funding.





# CGCN Update



## Clean Vines FAQ

With the need to replant many vineyards in Ontario and across the majority of Canada's main grape growing regions, it is more important than ever to ensure that vineyards are being replaced with certified clean, virus-tested plant material. CGCN-RCCV has developed an information sheet to answer some frequently asked questions about clean vines and certification programs that is meant to help educate and empower growers to make informed decisions when purchasing and/or planting clean grapevines. This document was developed in collaboration with the British Columbia Wine Grape Council, the Grape Growers of Ontario, le Conseil des vins du Québec, and the Grape Growers' Association of Nova Scotia.

## CGCN-RCCV Review of France's Grapevine Certification System

CGCN-RCCV's Review Committee has been working diligently over the last 6 months to evaluate France's Grapevine Certification system to determine if it should be recommended to be eligible for recognition for replant programming purposes. The CGCN-RCCV Board of Directors will provide a statement to each of the provincial grape growing associations and their respective initiative administrators by March 31st, 2025. This statement will serve as a consultative letter of advice, NOT a final decision on vine eligibility for each replanting initiative.

## Webinar: Recovery From Climate-Related Events

Our first webinar of 2025, held on January 22nd, focused on recovery from climate-related events, which is a topic that has been top-of-mind in Canada for the last few years given various cold damage events across the country. This webinar addressed how climate change relates to vineyard management, variety selection, and more.

Dr. Gregory Jones of Abacela Winery in the Umpqua Valley of Oregon spoke generally about climate structure and available variety options. Dr. Elizabeth (Lizzie) Wolkovich discussed local and general grapevine variety information in greater detail, including the intersection of climate and variety selection. Finally, both presentations were followed by an engaging Q&A session.

# OGWRI Update

Grapevine trunk diseases (GTDs) are considered among the most destructive fungal diseases affecting grapes. However, they have largely been ignored in Ontario vineyards, where vine decline, and death are often attributed to cold injury rather than pathogenic infections.

Dr. Wendy McFadden-Smith, professional affiliate at Brock University's Cool Climate Oenology and Viticulture Institute (CCOVI), and Dr. Oualid Ellouz, Plant Pathologist at Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada's Vineland research station, are studying the prevalence and impact of GTDs in Ontario through their project titled "**Activity 10 - Grapevine Trunk Disease: an under-rated threat to the Ontario grape industry?**". This project is funded in part by the Government of Canada under the Sustainable Canadian Agricultural Partnership (SCAP) in collaboration with the [Canadian Grapevine Certification Network](#) (CGCN-RCCV) through the [National Grape & Wine Science Cluster](#) from 2023-2028.

GTDs can weaken grapevines, reducing vigor, fruit yield, and quality, while also shortening vine lifespan. This project aims to address these challenges by:

1. Establishing a base line understanding of the GTD prevalence in Ontario vineyards through year-round monitoring.
2. Determine the epidemiology of GTD in Ontario vineyard conditions.
3. Investigating and implementing novel and existing chemicals and biological control strategies against GTD.
4. Developing training tools to improve identification of GTD and provide guidance for science-based management.

A key focus of this research is determining optimal pruning times to minimize infection risks, as pruning wounds are primary entry points for GTD pathogens. By enhancing disease awareness and management practices, this work will contribute to the long-term sustainability of Ontario's grape industry.

Despite a slow start due to delayed funding, the team has made significant steps in setting the stage for groundbreaking research into combating fungal diseases in grapevines. As of March 31st, 2024 (marking the end of year 1), Dr. McFadden-Smith and Dr. Ellouz have identified both commercial and experimental vineyards that will serve as the cornerstone of their research. The experimental vineyards include both red and white varieties known for their varying degrees of cold sensitivity, such as Pinot Noir, Chardonnay Muscat, Sauvignon Blanc, Cabernet Franc, and Cabernet Sauvignon. ## How it Works:

**Step 2** – Within a week, you'll be connected to a counsellor that you can see on an ongoing basis by phone, video, or in person (based on availability). The mental health professionals who provide counselling are ag-informed to best serve the community.

**Step 3** – Engage in counselling for as long as you need. Sessions are free and unlimited. Finding the right counsellor is important. If you'd like to be matched with someone new, you can call the line back and be matched with someone who may be a better fit – no questions asked.

## What you need to know:

Ontario-based farmers, farm workers and their families (spouses, partners, children, dependents). This includes family members involved in the operation of the farm. Note: callers must be 16 years or older. Youth between the ages of 12-15 may utilize the service with parental consent.






# Wine Sales Update- Period 11



All sales statistics that follow are for the 13 Periods ending February 1, 2025, unless noted and reflect sales through ALL LCBO channels excluding Specialty Services; including Home Consumer, Licensee, Agency, Embassy and shipments to Grocers and Convenience. All data excludes flavoured wines and ciders.

## Highlights:

- VQA wine sales overall are up 10.8% for rolling 13 periods (litres)
- VQA wine sales are down at the LCBO stores (-9.1% litres)
- VQA wine sales in grocery are increasing (+53.3% litres)
- Sales to Convenience YTD grew by 88,076 litres
- Ontario Non-VQA is declining (-3.8%)
- Ontario non-IDB (100% Ontario) is increasing (+1.1%)
- Ontario IDB is down (-4.1%)
